

Plane Life Aircraft Rental Agreement

This Aircraft Rental Agreement (“Agreement”) is entered into between **Plane Life Aviation, LLC** (“Lessor”) and the undersigned renter (“Lessee”) for the rental and operation of Plane Life aircraft under the following terms and conditions.

1. Renter Eligibility

Lessee affirms that they:

- Hold a current and valid FAA pilot certificate appropriate to the aircraft category and class.
- Possess a current FAA medical certificate (if applicable).
- Have completed a Plane Life checkout and flight review within the past 12 calendar months.
- Meet all currency and proficiency requirements under FAR Part 61 and 91.
- Will carry their certificate, medical, and photo ID at all times during operation.

2. Authorized Use

Lessee may operate the aircraft only for non-commercial purposes under Part 91.

The aircraft may not be used for:

- Instruction to others without written approval from Plane Life.
- Operations for compensation or hire.
- Formation flight, aerobatics, or low-level operations.
- Flight into known or forecast icing conditions (unless properly equipped and approved).
- Off-airport or unapproved landing sites.
- International flights without written authorization.

3. Aircraft Condition & Care

- Lessee must conduct a complete preflight inspection before each flight.
- Any damage, mechanical issue, or discrepancy must be reported immediately.
- Aircraft must be returned clean, refueled, and secured after use.
- Smoking, vaping, or use of open flame in or near the aircraft is strictly prohibited.
- Lessee is responsible for ensuring the aircraft logbook and documents remain onboard and secure.

4. Scheduling & Cancellations

- Aircraft reservations must be made in advance through Plane Life’s scheduling system.
- Cancellations within 24 hours of the reservation may incur a cancellation fee.
- Late returns beyond the reserved time may be billed at an hourly overage rate.
- No-show reservations may result in suspension of rental privileges.

5. Insurance & Liability

- Plane Life maintains hull and liability insurance on the aircraft.
- Lessee is responsible for the deductible amount (typically \$2,500–\$5,000) for any damage occurring during their rental period.
- Lessee assumes full responsibility for violations of FAA regulations or negligent operation.
- Insurance does not cover unauthorized use or unapproved destinations.

6. Weather & Operational Judgment

- Flights shall only be conducted under weather conditions suitable for the pilot's rating and comfort level.
- If weather deteriorates en route, the pilot shall land and wait for safe conditions — safety takes precedence over schedule.
- Lessee must comply with all NOTAMs, TFRs, and airspace restrictions.

7. Rental Fees

- Hourly rates are based on Hobbs or Tach time as specified.
- All fees must be paid promptly after flight completion.
- Fuel purchased off-site will be reimbursed at Plane Life's posted rate with receipts provided.

8. Dos and Don'ts for Renters

DO:

- Perform thorough preflight and postflight inspections.
- Comply fully with FAA and Plane Life safety standards.
- Fly within your personal and legal limits.
- Report any irregularities immediately.
- Return the aircraft refueled and clean.

DON'T:

- Allow anyone else to act as PIC or manipulate controls.
- Operate under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Fly into adverse weather or beyond your comfort level.
- Tamper with avionics, maintenance items, or installed equipment.
- Ignore minor issues — always report them.

9. Agreement Acknowledgment

By signing below, Lessee acknowledges that they have read, understood, and agree to comply with all terms of this Aircraft Rental Agreement and Plane Life operational policies. Lessee accepts full responsibility for safe operation of the aircraft while under their control.
